

#### THE HISTORY OF HILLSIDE

The largest Black schools in Durham prior to the building of Whitted School in 1887 were the Ledger Public School in Hayti, under the supervision of Miss Ledger, and the Hack Road Public School, where James Whitted, "a highly respected man of mixed races (Black and Native American) who had managed to educate himself," was superintendent.

In 1887, the Whitted School existed as the James A. Whitted High School, in honor of its first principal. The school, which was located on the corner of Blackwell and Pettigrew Streets, burned in 1888 and was relocated in a Bull Factory warehouse. In 1890, 161 pupils attended the school's six grades. Whitted taught the upper grades, William G. Pearson taught the middle grades, and two female teachers taught the first and second grades.

The first class graduated from the ninth grade of Whitted School in 1896. Also in 1896, a permanent brick building was constructed on Proctor and Ramsey Streets for Black children at a cost of \$8000. In 1899, the building was destroyed and reconstructed, but students were housed in churches during that school year. In 1901, another Black school, West End, was built. At this time, 707 students were enrolled in the Durham Black graded schools. In 1909, the East End School was constructed.

Only nine grades existed at Whitted from 1896 until 1911, when a tenth grade was added. The 11th grade was added in 1918. From 1919 until 1920, first graders were housed in "dog houses," which were temporary shacks near the brick school building.

The first classes at Whitted included manual training, domestic science and drawing. In 1912, the emphasis was on vocational education and good citizenship in the Black schools. Classes taught were barbering, laundry work, cooking, carpentry, masonry, shoemaking and bricklaying. A laundry department was built in the basement of Whitted School, "to teach laundering as a possible vocation for Negro girls." In 1917, shoe repair and agricultural courses were added.

The Whitted School, which was in poor condition, burned in 1921, and students had to attend double sessions at East End and West End Schools. John Sprunt Hill, a leading Durham citizen, donated land for a new building on Pine and Umstead Streets. The name Hillside dates from 1922 when students moved to the new building, which was up the hill from Hillside Park, a public city-owned Black park and in honor of John Sprunt Hill who had donated the land.

The "Park" was dropped from the name Hillside High School in 1943. In 1950, because of overcrowding in the high school, the Hillside High School students moved into what was then called Whitted Junior High School, located near the campus of North Carolina Central University (NCCU) on Concord Street. The Whitted Junior High School students moved into the old Hillside Park High School building closer to downtown Durham. The schools' buildings also swapped names. Hillside High School at this time only enrolled 10th, 11th, and 12th grades and Whitted Junior High School enrolled 7th, 8th, and 9th grades. The class of 1944 was the first to graduate under the 12-year system.

Additions of an auditorium, cafeteria, auto shop, classroom, and gymnasium were made to accommodate a large number of transferred high school students in 1949. A classroom annex was added to the Hillside building in 1962. In 1966, a new library was added. A new band room was constructed in 1975. Hillside was relocated to a brand new state-of-the-art building on Fayetteville Street in 1995.

Hillside has come a long way since it first existed as a small grade school in the 1880's. It is the oldest of five remaining historically Black high schools still operating in North Carolina out of more than 300 such schools in existence during segregation.





James Jackson "Biff" Henderson

James "Biff" Henderson is a graduate of the Hillside Class of 1967. While at Hillside Henderson was a serious tennis player and was a member of the Hornet tennis team. Using his early interest in communicating with people, he was a part of the Hornet yearbook staff. His father was a successful businessman, bank chairman, and head of the Durham Housing Authority. James and his family had comfortable middle-class life where they were involved in Durham community. After graduating from Hillside ,James earned a degree in Business Administration from Hampton Institute (now Hampton University).

He also served in the United States Army during the Vietnam War. After college, Henderson was drafted into the Army. In 1968 and '69, he spent more than a year with an artillery patrol unit stationed at Dong Ha Combat Base in Vietnam. He worked as a stage manager on the 1969 version of To Tell The Truth. He joined NBC in the early 1970s, working first for the NBC Radio sales department and then as stage manager during NBC's coverage of the World Series and coverage of various NASA missions.

 Henderson is an American comedian and television personality best known for his work on the Late Show with David Letterman. His association with David Letterman, which spanned 35 years, began in 1980 as a stage manager on The David Letterman Show (NBC).
He appeared in occasional humorous segments, which often involved interviewing people at public places and events.

He rejoined David Letterman with the launch of Late Night with David Letterman (NBC) in 1982, remaining with it and Late Show with David Letterman (CBS) for their entire runs. Henderson frequently participated in the on-screen antics and sometimes was the star of short segments recounting his humorous adventures in New York. Henderson's "theme" music on the show was "Milestones" by Miles Davis.







## **Gloria Evans Rentrope**







#### **Gloria Ann Evans Hawkins Rentrope**

My life has been full of excitement and challenges.

I was born in Lincoln Hospital in Durham to Ulysses Sylvester Evans and Servater Nunn Evans.

I attended W. G. Pearson Elementary School, J.A. Whitted Junior High School, Hillside High School and North Carolina College before leaving Durham to attend graduate school at Case Western Reserve University, School of Applied Social Sciences now the Mandel School of Social Work.

Following my graduation from Hillside High School in 1963, I spent the summer in New York. While in New York, I attended the March on Washington in DC on August 28, 1963 with a group from New York that had some Durhamites as part of the contingency.

I enter North Carolina College now North Carolina Central University in September of 1963 on a partial scholarship and work-study. I was a cum laude graduate in 1967.

Since 1959, I had been involved in Civil Rights activities' including picketing Howard Johnson's so that Blacks could sit at the counter to eat what was at that time, 13 favors of Howard Johnson's ice cream.

I continued my community and civil rights involvement throughout High School, College, in Cleveland, Ohio and even now in some form. I have protested in North Carolina, Washington, DC, New York and Ohio and as the results of some of the protests, I have been arrested.

I worked for the North Carolina Fund and the Foundation for Community Development during the summers of 1967 (in Washington, NC) and 1968 (in Goldsboro, NC). I was with a group that the Klan tried to scare/run us out of "Little Washington," North Carolina. The Klan was not successful and the plight of what was going on went all of the way to Washington, DC. It was through this work experience that Howard Fuller persuaded me to go to graduated school. I was blessed to have several offers to attend different graduate programs but chose to attend Howard Fuller's alma mater, the School of Applied Social Sciences, now the Mandel School of Social Work at what is now Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio. I obtained a Masters Degree in Social Administration in 1969.

Rather than come back to NC as I first planned to do, I remained in Cleveland. During my stay in Cleveland I got married and I worked as a Community Activist. My first "real" job was that of Assistant Director then later as Director of Friendly Inn Settlement House, a community agency in Cleveland, Ohio. I was the first Black female Director of this agency. I left Friendly Inn and became a Community Consultant in Cleveland. During this time I had three children, one of whom is deceased.

In 1975, my life took a dramatic turn which included a separation and later divorce, I returned to Durham. While I continued my community/civil rights involvement, I also accepted Jesus Christ in my life as my Lord and Savior. During this time, I joined Mount Zion Baptist Church which later became Mount Zion Christian Church. I became an active part of this ministry. I grew up in White Rock Baptist Church and was there from birth to 1967. I worked at Durham County Department of Social Services for one year before being riffed but this led me to a position at the University of North Carolina Healthcare system. I held positions as Clinical Social Worker and Program Director during my 32 years at UNC. I retired in 2008. I was one of the original founders of the Adolescent Pregnancy Program in North Carolina, and served on the Advisory Committee for the Orange County Adolescent Parenting Program. I wrote the Safe Surrender and Adoption policies for the UNC Hospitals; served on numerous committees/advisory boards in Orange and Durham counties as well as Hospital Committees. I have presented at some Workshops, helped to organized several workshops and have attended/continue to attend workshops/conferences/seminars. # **Andre Leon Talley**

HALL OF FAME



## **Andre Leon Talley**



André Leon Talley (October 16, 1948 – January 18, 2022) was an American fashion journalist, stylist, creative director, and editor-at-large of Vogue magazine. He was the magazine's fashion news director from 1983 to 1987, its first African-American male creative director from 1988 to 1995, and then its editor-at-large from 1998 to 2013. Often regarded as a fashion icon, he was known for supporting emerging designers and advocating for diversity in the fashion industry; while the capes, kaftans, and robes he wore became his trademark look. Talley also served on the judging panel for America's Next Top Model (from Cycle 14 to Cycle 17).

He also authored three books, including the memoir The Chiffon Trenches, which landed on The New York Times Best Seller list; and co-authored a book with Richard Bernstein. Talley was the editor-at-large of Numéro Russia in 2013, before resigning due to anti-LGBT laws in Russia. He additionally worked stints with Andy Warhol at Interview, Women's Wear Daily, W, Ebony and The New York Times. He once served as a stylist for United States President Barack Obama and First Lady Michelle Obama during their time in the White House; as well as styling Melania Trump for her 2005 wedding to Donald Trump.

In 2020, France awarded him the Chevalier de l'ordre des Arts et des Letres honor for arts and leters; and the following year he received the North Carolina Award for his role in literature. He was featured in the documentaries The First Monday in May and The September Issue, and was the subject of the documentary, The Gospel According to André directed by Kate Novack.

Through the student connections he made in Providence, Rhode Island, he apprenticed, unpaid, for Diana Vreeland at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in 1974. Thoroughly impressed by his skills, the Vogue editor arranged for Talley to work at Andy Warhol's Factory and Interview magazine for \$50 a week. He went on to write for Women's Wear Daily, becoming its Paris bureau chief, and W, from 1975 through 1980. He also worked for The New York Times, Ebony, and other publications before finally landing at Vogue, where he worked as the fashion news director from 1983 to 1987 and, later, as the magazine's first African-American male creative director from 1988 to 1995.

He pushed top designers to feature more Black models in their shows. In 1984, he co-wrote with Richard Bernstein the book MegaStar, with an introduction by Paloma Picasso, which includes portraits of celebrities. He left his role as creative director at Vogue, while continuing to serve as contributing editor, in order to move to Paris in 1995 to work for W. In 1998, he returned to Vogue as the editor-at-large, a position he held until his departure in 2013 to pursue another editorial venture.

In 2003, he authored an autobiography entitled A.L.T.: A Memoir, published by Villard in 2003. According to Publishers Weekly, the message delivered by the book is that "Style transcends race, class, and mite." Two years later, he authored A.L.T. 365+, an art monograph designed by art director Sam Shahid, featuring photos and captions from one year of Talley's life.

In 2008, Talley advised the Obama family on fashion, while also styling Michelle Obama for her first Vogue cover, and introducing her to Taiwanese-Canadian designer Jason Wu, who went on to make several dresses for the First Lady, including her inaugural gown. Talley's later pairings were with designers Tracy Reese, Rachel Roy, and singer-actress Jennifer Hudson. He also styled Melania Trump for her 2005 wedding to Donald Trump. From March 2010 to December 2011, Talley served on the judging panel for America's Next Top Model (from Cycle 14 to Cycle 17). From 2013 to 2014, he served as international editor of Numéro Russia, joining the team shortly after the magazine launched in March 2013 but resigned after 12 issues due to anti-LGBT laws in Russia. He was a member of the Board of Trustees of the Savannah College of Art and Design since 1995.

In January 2017, he live-blogged the Trump inauguration with New York Times columnist Maureen Dowd. In April of that year, Talley began hosting his own radio show centered on fashion and pop culture on Sirius XM satellite station Radio Andy.

Talley is the subject of a documentary film The Gospel According to André, directed by Kate Novack, which was screened in September 2016 at the Toronto Film Festival and was released in the U.S. on May 25, 2018. Reviewing the film, Variety said: "The documentary is a deeply loving, frequently beautiful testament to the former Vogue editor, who rose from humble beginnings in North Carolina to become arguably the high fashion world's first major African-American tastemaker, as well as the type of multi-lingual, Russian-lit-citing public intellectual who is perfectly at ease gossiping on TV with Wendy Williams." Talley was also featured in the documentaries The First Monday in May and The September Issue.

He released The Chiffon Trenches: A Memoir on May 19, 2020. In it, he chronicles his start in New York City in the 1970s, his tumultuous relationship with Wintour, and his experiences with racism in the fashion world. It became a New York Times Best Seller.

From 1972-1982 she was an entrepreneur, owning and operating a small chain of independent bookstores and a government contracting business.

Currently she is the President and Chair of the board of Durham Colored Library, Inc. (DCL) one of the oldest non-profit organizations in Durham, NC. DCL was founded in 1913 by her Great Grandfather Dr. Aaron McDuffie Moore and chartered as a non-profit in 1918. This organization is "dedicated to lifting up stories about African Americans, both current and historical, to create a more comprehensive picture of the American experience."

In 2015, she initiated the DCL sponsorship of a definitive biography of Dr. Moore and six years later - in May 2020, UNC Press published the biography. DCL continues to publish and distribute the Merrick Washington Magazine for the visually impaired which was founded by her grandmother, Lyda Moore Merrick in 1952. The newest DCL project is **Techies4Tomorrow**<sup>SM</sup> (T4T) which is a learning game containing animated stories about Black STEM professionals made available to primarily Black 8-10 year old children through afterschool and out-of-school programs. When these children play the T4T game, they learn about and see people who look like them succeeding in STEM professions. The goals is that the children then begin to realize the importance of learning their math and science lessons well, if they want become like some of those in the stories they've experienced.

Eileen often lectures on Durham's Black Wall Street and its lasting effects. She and her husband Jim have two married sons and three grandchildren.



Roy Alston, trophy legend has been making trophies in the Durham community for 43 years and doesn't plan on stopping.

As a Pittsboro native growing up, Alston had only one thing to do and that was to finish school. "My parents wanted me to go to school, study hard, and get good grades and that's what I did," said Alston. After Alston finished high school, he went straight into the workforce and worked at UNC Chapel Hill as a dietary assistant, washing dishes. Alston then moved up the chain to become a Sterilize Operator for nine years.

While Alston was sweeping the floor in his shop, he said that he also helped with doctors that did research on animals.

"Make a long story short, I did the first heart transplant on a rat that lived for 21 days," said Alston.

The doctor that Alston worked with left, so he then went to work with the Department of Immunology at UNC, running the operating room of the rats.

"Working with these doctors I was able to get mentioned in medical journals dealing with animal research," said Alston proudly.

But growing up, working and school was not the only thing Alston did. He also played sports.

At 13, Alston began to play baseball in the community league. He had a love for baseball and played for about 20 years, from the age of 13 to 33. In his young adult years, Alston played for the Durham Rams, which was a black baseball team.

"We played a lot of prominent teams that were already established in the Negro Leagues," said Alston. While cleaning up some in his shop, Alston said "We would travel around North and South Carolina just to play."

The Durham Rams played at Durham Athletic Park where N.C. Central University's baseball team now plays and the site for many scenes from the 1988 film "Bull Durham."

Alston, picking up a broom and sweeping again, begins to talk about the other team in Durham which was an all white team that they played against.

"Our team played the other team in Durham which was a white team and when we played each other the stands would be filled, but we won most of the games," said Alston.

During his Durham Ram days, Alston explains that the guys that he played with could have all went to the majors if they had an outlet.

"The best ball players never got to play," said Alston. Alston also said that some people even included him in the mix of the players that could have gone to the majors.

Alston found his calling shortly after his baseball days ended. When he played in tournaments they

never had their trophies on time. "That's how I got started into making trophies," said Alston.

"I took a gamble and no one believed in it and then I became the first trophy outlet in the city of Durham," said Alston. After Alston started there were more businesses like his that whites owned.

Alston didn't feel awkward because he had already well established his business.

On the day his shop was ruined by an old fuse box Alston said "I cried like a baby." But Alston made some adjustments and started to work out of his house until his shop is back up and running. "It's been a long 22 months," said Alston

As Alston was walking out of his shop he said, "You can't live in this world by yourself, I have other

#### Reflections of a Life Well Lived

Mr. Roy Earl Alston, an ambitious yet cautious man, was born on February 9, 1938 in Pittsboro, North Carolina. He was the oldest of four children of the late Julius J. Alston and Nettie M. Alston. He departed this life on Tuesday, June 29, 2021.

He was affectionately known as "peanut" in his early years and Roy in his later years. His faith journey

started at Mitchell Chapel AM.E. Zion Church in Pittsboro, North Carolina and later at Kyles Temple AM.E. Zion Church. At Kyles Temple, he served as Chair of the Building Committee and President of Senior/Gospel choir.

Roy's formal education was completed at Horton High School in Pittsboro, North Carolina. At an early

age, Roy learned the importance and value of working and worked all of his life. Roy worked several jobs at UNC Memorial Hospital in Chapel Hill, North Carolina, but his last job was a Research Associate. He performed the first heart transplant on a mouse, which lived ten days. At the time, this event was recorded in the American Medical Journal. After 16 years at UNC Memorial Hospital, he became interested in entrepreneurship. He taught himself the skill of engraving, followed by opening the only African American owned trophy shop in North Carolina. Triangle Trophy Center opened in 1970. On April 28, 2020, Roy marked 50 years of business.

Roy was a valued community member serving many organizations. He was an active member of Horton

High School Reunion of Classes, serving as a Board Member, Event and Food Coordinators. He was an active member of the Negro Baseball League, playing for the Durham Rams from 1959 to 1969. He was a longtime member of the James E. Shepard Sertoma Club, served 30 years in the United States Army Reserves, and through the Durham Parks and Recreation department he sponsored Triangle Trophy Men and Women's softball teams.

Roy loved to grill food, coordinate bus tours throughout the United States and played softball. He was a

true family man spending time with his lovely wife and daughter, parents, in-laws and siblings. A favorite event was an annual trip to Hilton Head Island, South Carolina.

Roy's wife Jean and his parents preceded him in death. He leaves to cherish his memory and legacy, to



Mr. Curry worked as an administrator in several Durham Public schools before he was asked to join the





#### **Andre D. Vann** Coordinator of University Archives and Instructor of Public History Dr. James E. Shepard Memorial Library Archivist-Historian-Author

Andre D. Vann, archivist, author, griot, and educator has served as the North Carolina Central University (NCCU) Coordinator of the University Archives and Instructor of Public History since 2007. He was born by midwife, in his family's home in Henderson, North Carolina, and raised in the Mobile community, a community founded by Rebecca Hawkins his great- great grandmother. Vann graduated from Vance Senior High in 1988. Vann started his love and appreciation for African American history at the age of 10, while sitting on front porches and listening to elders in his community. He also gained love and appreciation for this history by working in his parents' grocery store, Vann's Grocery and Fish Market, a center of commercial life in south Henderson.

After high school, he ventured to Durham, North Carolina to attend NCCU, where he was active in student government affairs and joined the Gamma Beta Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. He is a double "Eagle" receiving both his Bachelor of Arts (1993) and Master of Arts (1995) degrees in American History from NCCU. While there he was inducted into the Phi Alpha Theta Honorary Historians Society. In 1997, he received advanced training in Public History and archival management at North Carolina State University. Upon graduation, he taught African American history and North Carolina history in the History Department of both NCCU and Shaw University (Raleigh, NC). Andre completed the University Managers Development Program at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 2003.

Prior to establishing the University Archives at NCCU, Andre served as Assistant Dean of Students in the Division of Students Affairs. Currently, he serves as Coordinator of University Archives and Instructor of Public History in the Dr. James E. Shepard Memorial Library. He has dedicated over 25 years to the cause of higher education, historical preservation, archival preservation, volunteerism and service to humanity. At present, Andre' serves on the Durham Cultural Advisory Board and the Hayti Healing Circle by appointment of the Mayor of Durham and the City Council. In addition, Andre' serves as Co - PI of the Getty Digital Grant (NCCU). His most memorable experiences were at the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University, and the John F. Kennedy Presidential Library in Boston, Massachusetts.

His research interests are African American History, 20th Century United States History, Southern history, African Americans in Public History and Public Memory and civil rights. He is especially interested in understanding the complex connections between African American history, memory, funerary, race, "Black Wall Street", and social change in Durham, North Carolina through the twentieth and twenty-first century A leading researcher on the African American experience he has been profiled by the *Durham Herald-Sun, News and Observer, Henderson Daily Dispatch, NCCU Campus Echo, North Carolina Historical Review, Regional Focus/Federal Reserve Board, Indy Week, Triangle Tribune*, WUNC 91.5 FM, WNCU.90.7, WARR 1520 AM Radio Stations and many other publications. As a result, Andre' was featured on the WUNC - "State of Things" for his work in researching and preserving African American history and his family's history. He has authored "Standing on the Promises: The Growth and Development of the Shiloh Baptist Church of Henderson, North Carolina, 1866-1996" (1996) and published works in the <u>African American National Biography (2008), Encyclopedia of African American Associations</u> and the <u>Encyclopedia of African American Education</u>. He authored African Americans of <u>Durham County (2017), he co-authored Soaring on the Legacy: A Concise History of North</u> <u>Carolina Central University (2010), he co-authored a book entitled Sedalia and the Palmer</u> <u>Memorial Institute (2004); authored one book entitled Vance County, North Carolina (2000) and</u> <u>co-authored another entitled Images of America-Durham's Hayti (1999) all are still in print</u>.

He holds membership in the Historical Society of North Carolina, Charlotte Hawkins

Brown Historical Foundation, Inc., Friends of Geer Cemetery, Friends of the Stanford L. Warren Branch Library, Friends of the Durham County Public Library, Phi Alpha Theta Honorary Historians Society, NCCU AA, NCCU AA – Durham Chapter, Durham Committee on the Affairs of Black People (Former Executive Director, Vice Chair - PAC, Chair - PAC (2012), Durham Branch of the NAACP (Unit 5387-B), Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. (Former District Historian for the Association of North Carolina Alphamen) and Immediate past 2nd Vice of the First Congressional District, Democratic Party of North Carolina.

He has been a consultant to the Duke University Samuel DuBois Cook Center on Social

Equity *Black Wall Street of the South: From Reconstruction to the Pandemic* (2021), United Durham Inc. - CDC History and Documentary Project (2020), North Carolina Institute of Minority Economic Development Historic Parrish Street Project (2006), North Carolina Central University Shepard House Project (2004), Lincoln Hospital Project for Durham County Hospital Corporation (1997) and the North Carolina African American High School Project (1992).

Because of his outstanding contributions to the community, Vann has received numerous awards and recognitions. Clement, III Public Service Award - presented by the Beta Theta Lambda Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., Durham, North Carolina (2013), Certificate of Appreciation by the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. Centennial Committee (2006) and "Award of Gratitude" from the Friends of the Stanford L. Warren Branch Library (2002).
