History of Hillside High School







The largest black schools in Durham prior to the building of Whitted School in 1887 were the Ledger Public School in Hayti and the Hack Road Public School. James Whitted, a highly respected man of mixed races (Black and Native American) who had managed to educate himself, was superintendent of Ledger Public School.

In 1887, what is now called Hillside High School was founded under the name of Whitted School in honor of its first principal, James A. Whitted. The school, which was located on the corner of Blackwell and Pettigrew Streets, burned in 1888 and it was relocated into the Bull Factory warehouse. In 1890, 161 pupils attended the school's six grades. Whitted taught the upper grades, William G. Person taught the middle grades and two female teachers taught the first and second grades.

The first class graduated from the ninth grade of Whitted School in 1896. Also, in 1896, a permanent brick building was constructed on Proctor and Ramsey Street for black children at a cost of \$8,000.00. In 1899, the building was destroyed and reconstructed, but students were housed in churches during that school year. In 1901, another black school, West End, was built. At this time 707 students were enrolled in the Durham black graded schools. In 1909, the East End School was constructed.

Only nine grades existed at Whitted from 1896 until 1911, but in 1911 a tenth grade was added. The 11th grade was added in 1918. From 1919 until 1920, first graders were housed in "dog houses," which were temporary shacks near the brick school building.

The Whitted School, which was in poor condition, burned in 1921, and students had to attend double sessions at East End and West End Schools. John Sprunt Hill, a leading Durham citizen, donated land for a new building on Pine and Umstead Streets, which was named Hillside Park High School in honor of the donor and the fact that the school was located next to Hillside Park, a public city owned black park. The class of 1944 was the first to graduate under the 12-year system.

The "Park" was dropped form the name Hillside High School in 1943. In 1950, because of overcrowding in the high school, the student body moved into what was then called Whitted Junior High School, located near the campus of North Carolina Central University (NCCU) on Concord Street and the Whitted Junior High School students moved into the Old Hillside Park High School building closer to downtown Durham. The school's buildings also swapped names. Hillside High School at this time only enrolled 10th, 11th, and 12th grades and Whitted Junior High School enrolled 7th, 8th, and 9th.

Additions of an auditorium, cafeteria, auto shop, classrooms and a gymnasium were made to accommodate the number of high school students in 1949. A classroom annex was added to the Hillside building in 1962. In 1966 a new library was added, and a new band room was constructed in 1975. Hillside was relocated to a brand new, state-of-the-art building on Fayetteville Street in 1995.

Hillside has come a long way since it first existed as a small grade school in the 1880s. The educational goals which it founders set at that early date set the standard for the Legacy of excellence to which countless generations of Hillside graduates have contributed.

Virginia Watson Adams Class of 1963

Virginia Watson Adams, PhD, RN, FAAN is the daughter of Floyd and Gracie Green Watson of Durham, NC, and sister to Floyd Watson Jr., Robert Lee Watson, Mary Louise Blue, Shirley Ann Jones and William Aerique Watson. She is the proud mother of Tonja Camille Gooden and William Aeric Adams and grandmother of Jalen Khalil Thompson.



Her most recent career contributions were in the role dean of the UNC Wilmington School of Nursing (SON) and first director of the inaugural National League for Nursing (NLN) Center for Diversity and Global Initiatives. After serving a year as interim dean at East Tennessee State University College of Nursing, she became the first African American dean at UNC Wilmington School of Nursing. In the Wilmington community, she became the first African American nurse to simultaneously serve on a hospital board, a public health board, a mental health board and area health education board, two of which she chaired. Partnering with NC Representatives Thomas Wright, Danny McComas and Carolyn Justice and Senator Julia Boseman; also, Downtown Wilmington Rotary Club and UNCW administration, she secured \$30M in funding for the design and construction of a new facility for its School of Nursing, the only building on campus that was fully funded from inception. Other community engagement initiatives included two nursemanaged clinics in rural communities, a school health center and a successful 4-year SON pipeline health careers academy (Camp Bones) for under-represented students.

In her role as the first director of the inaugural NLN Center for Diversity and Global Initiatives, she gave voice to the critical need for a more diverse nurse educator workforce to the 40,000 members of NLN and over 1200 member schools through an annual workshop on diversity and inclusion strategies. A vision statement about achieving diversity and meaningful inclusion in nursing education was developed and made available to all nursing education programs followed by a diversity and inclusivity toolkit to guide nursing education programs in their efforts to achieve excellence. She planned and facilitated a yearly global roundtable for faculty who were educated in countries other than the US or had current academic partnerships with other nations. Strategies that addressed common nursing education issues were developed. As the inaugural chair of the Core Steering Group of the International Council of Nurses Education Network (ICNEN), she convened a core steering group from Australia, Finland, Taiwan, United Kingdom and South Africa, that represented their regions of the world. Quarterly virtual meetings were with the Core Steering Group. Face to face meetings regarding global nursing education issues were convened during the biennial ICN Congress in countries around the world.

Currently, Dr. Adams is Chair of the Physical & Mental Health Subcommittee of the Wilmington (NC) Alumnae Chapter, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., Co-chair of the American Academy of Nursing Diversity & Inclusivity Committee and a member of the New Hanover County Consolidated Public Health and Social Services Board.

Dr. Adams received her BSN from Winston-Salem State University, MSN from UNC-Chapel Hill and PhD from UNC Greensboro. She has a 13-year military history (active and reserve) and achieved the rank of Lt. Colonel.

Selected Honors include Fellow in the American Academy of Nursing, WSSU Distinguished Nurse Educator Award and UNC-Chapel Hill Distinguished Contributions to Nursing Education Award.

Audrey Fairley Boykin Class of 1959

Audrey Fairley Boykin is the eldest of the three children of the late Mable and Frederick Douglas Fairley's. After graduating from Hillside High School in 1959, she received a BS degree in biology with a minor in media from North Carolina Central University. She began her professional career in the Medical Records Division at New York University but returned to Durham and taught math and science at Fayetteville Street School, Shepard Middle School, and Rogers-Herr



Middle School. She did additional graduate work at Duke University and received a MA degree in educational administration and supervision with Summa Cum Laude honors from NCCU. She became assistant principal at Rogers Herr Middle School where she also served as Director of a joint Durham City Schools / Duke University Summer Enrichment and Masters of Arts in Teaching (MAT) Program. As Director of this program, she provided demonstration and internship opportunities for Duke University MAT students while working with students, teachers, and parents in area public and private schools.

In 1986, Boykin became principal at C.C. Spaulding Elementary School and was recognized for leadership in student achievement with the N&O media depiction "CC Spaulding Students Defy All Testing Odds!" The school was also awarded the State's Golden Key Award for innovative approaches to parent involvement. Audrey also received WTVD's acclaimed "Educator of the Year Award" and was featured as one of the stations "Hometown Heroes." She received the Ebonette's "Making a Difference Award" and also honored as a Durham Woman of Distinction for her service to the community. She was co-producer of two educational videos for television with then State Superintendent Craig Phillips. Audrey participated in a foreign study project affording local students in Durham public and private schools as well as Chapel Hill/Carrboro students the opportunity to travel to France, England, and Italy.

Audrey became principal of Pearsontown Elementary School, an institution recognized for outstanding student achievement - and after retiring, she returned to DPS partnering with that was facing academic challenges. After working with this program, she became an adjunct professor at NCCU were she methods classes in mathematics and science. Audrey's religious and civic focus has been a paramount compliment to her life. She currently attends Peace Missionary Baptist Church and has participated in Bible Study Fellowship (BSF) for many years. Additional civic involvement included North Carolina Association of Educators, Durham Chamber of Commerce Education Task Force, Durham Literacy Council, Duke University's Center for Documentary Studies, Community Alliance for Global Study Projects, Literate Ladies of Durham Book Club, the Alpha Zeta Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. and a founding member of SS Renaissance Corporation. In spite of health issues, she has continued her service to the community. Although Boykin is the biological mother of one daughter, Hope Boykin, she has mentored numerous students - providing both moral and financial support where needed. She planted the seed of "reaching back, grabbing one" in her daughter, Hope. Hope, as such, captured her mother's spirit and discovered an underprivileged student during one of her dance seminars, introduced him to her mother and, along with another member of her family, supplied financial support to this youth as he completed his high school and college years. Upon his graduation from Julliard, he has been able to become a renowned performer, choreographer, and lecturer throughout the country and world. After viewing the movie, "Blindside," he telephoned in tears thanking this family for assistance and proclaiming this film to be "his" story.

Since retirement, Boykin has continued to be involved with students and fellow seniors in a service capacity. She and family members provide an annual scholarship in honor of her late parents for high school seniors who are members of their church—Peace Missionary Baptist. It is not uncommon for her to receive request from friends, for prayer and spiritual support. She presents workshops and seminars; has organized activities to promote an understanding of the necessity to vote and arranges transportation to get citizens of Durham to the polls. In 2017, Audrey joined four Hillside High School alumni members to form the SS Renaissance Corporation to support the performing arts at Hillside High School. It was through this organization that the famed "Mr. G's Swing School" returned to the Hillside stage through the dynamic work of Mr. Wendell Tabb in his production of "Hallelujah, It's Swing School!" and students and teachers in area schools had the opportunity to learn more about the legacy of Hillside High School and its graduates who were "first" and/or very prominent in their professions. An outgrowth of this activity was the call from Mr. Tabb to sponsor an HHS Legacy Week-end Luncheon to compliment his formidable legacy weekend program.

Willie "Ricky" Brown Class of 1967

Willie Brown known to many as "Ricky" grew up with a passion for automobiles. During his tenure at Hillside he assembled a string of hot rods. After graduating from Hillside High School in 1967, he attended NCCU while continuing his quest to build fast cars. He was quoted as saying "I attended classes at NCCU and would come right back homeand crawl under my hot rod and continue working". While at the



University, Brown built his first race car which was a 1955 Chevrolet 2 door sedan boasting a 350 cubic inch, 400 horse powers, and manual transmission. One of his professors asked him to bring the race car to class for a "Show & Tell" discussion. His quest for gold continued as he broke the racial color barriers one race at a time. He was the first and only Black sportsman racer to enter and race at the newly built Rockingham Dragway sanctioned by NHRA for a national event.

After participating on the largest stage in drag racing with competitors from all over the nation, a fire was lit under him to take racing to heights where Blacks from the Triangle area had never been. Then in 1973, "Ricky" built a 1968 Chevy Camaro which he meticulously fine-tuned it to become one of the most highly favored cars to win the race on race day at any local track. He won eleven weekend races in a row at Sanford Dragstrip. After the final race the track owner refused to pay him all of the prize money. The track owner closed the track and converted it into a trailer park. The momentum continued into 1974 where his 1968 Camaro won a race at Dunn-Benson Dragstrip. As he was loading his car to leave the track, he found himself and his partner surrounded by several White competitors. The spokesman for the group told Brown "if you come back to this damn track again, I will personally put up a \$100 protest fee challenging the legality of your race car". The next weekend "Ricky" and his partner showed up again with seven \$100 bills taped inside the front windshield of his car-carrier truck (back then it was unheard of for a Black man to own a car transporter truck). Brown instructed the young boy on the gate to run and tell the posse that surrounded him last weekend that after the race, he wanted to protest all seven of them, not just one. As "Ricky" started to unload his race car, word came across the track P A system that no protest would be allowed that day. Chalk up another win for the Hillside graduate.

Over the next 30 years Willie Brown continued to build quality high performance cars both show and race cars (Camaros, Chevelles, and a Dodge). His biggest moment in racing came in the year 2000 when he returned to Rockingham Dragway and won the Super Chevy Show Magazine Race (Box). Not only did he receive a large cash prize and contingencies, but his picture was later put in Super Chevy Magazine which is sold worldwide. Brown retired after that illustrious win, but it wasn't over for him. In 2018 he was awarded a Humanitarian Award by a group out of Maryland called "The Crew" at Maryland International Raceway in Budds Creek, MD.

Today Willie "Ricky" Brown still attends big races up and down the East Coast. He says, "It's still in my blood but I like to just keep up with the new racing technology, meet new people, and hopefully meet the next Black legend of the sport from Hillside High School".

Fern Thorpe Dixon Class of 1964

Ferne Thorpe Dixon, daughter of the late John and Naomi Thorpe, was born at Lincoln Hospital in Durham, NC. She has one sister, Amelia, who is a 1957 graduate of Hillside High School (HHS). Ferne is a 1964 graduate of HHS. While at Hillside, she was a member of the National Honor Society, the marching and concert bands, and the French Club.



She attended North Carolina College (now North Carolina Central University) where she graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in French and English. During her sophomore year, she participated in an exchange program affording her the opportunity to spend a semester at the University of Wisconsin. Having established strong ties, Ferne continues to stay in touch with her student host.

While at NCCU, Ferne was inducted into the Alpha Chi Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. and Pi Delta Phi National French Honor Society. She returned to NCCU and received a Master of Arts degree in English.

In 1968, Ferne began her teaching career with the Durham Public Schools (DPS). Her first teaching job was as a French teacher at Whitted Junior High. A few years later, she began teaching at Durham High School (DHS) where she was chairperson of the French Department and DHS representative for the Duke-Durham Fellows Program.

During her tenure with DPS, a foreign-study project afforded Ferne the opportunity to chaperone students to France, England, Belgium, and Italy. Through her work with Sister Cities of Durham, she also took students to Kostroma, Russia. She taught English as a Second Language (ESL) at Durham Technical Community College for several years.

Ferne worked with colleagues, Julia Fairley and Barbara Porter Logan, to develop the program, Foreign Languages in the Elementary and Middle Schools (FLEMS). She became one of the television teachers for this project.

Her last five years as a teacher in DPS were spent at Hillside High School. There, she chaired a group of teachers and staff who recreated the Harlem Renaissance for the entire student body.

In 2017, Ferne worked with a team to form the Swing School Renaissance Corporation and worked diligently for two years on the goals of the organization. This included a Legacy Luncheon honoring Mr. H. Gattis' 100^{th} birthday and a Legacy Weekend honoring several HHS graduates. The Corporation's ultimate goal of bringing back Mr. G's Swing School to the Hillside stage was achieved with the production of "Hallelujah! It's a Swing School Musical" directed and produced by Mr. Wendell Tabb, Director of Theatre.

Additional contributions Ferne has made through SS Renaissance include:

- Study/Resource Guides recognizing achievements of Hillside graduates.
- Presentation of a check (\$13,000) to the Performing Arts Department at HHS.
- Joining others in support of naming the HHS auditorium the John Gattis/Wendell Tabb Theatre and the Wendell Tabb Stage. Ferne and the Renaissance team received Special Recognition Legacy Award plaques from the HHS drama department.


Other affiliations and activities that Ferne enjoys are the Literate Ladies Book Club, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Friday Friends (lunch bunch), Mission Payoff (helping the elderly), Sister Cities of Durham, HHS Class of '64, and the National Alumni Association of Hillside High School. She is a life-long member of White Rock Baptist Church.

Ferne is the mother of two adult children, Fredrick (Rick) Dixon (Suan) and Ivy Joy McMillan (Derrick). She is blessed to have a beautiful blended family of grandchildren and great-grands.

Claudine Daye Lewis Class of 1961

Mrs. Claudine Daye Lewis was the Salutatorian of her Hillside High School Class of 1961. Among other organizations, she was in the National Honor Society and was voted "Most Likely to Succeed."

After high school, Claudine entered North Carolina Central University (NCCU). While



Shortly after graduating from NCCU, Claudine was hired by IBM, where she trained as a Computer Programmer in Poughkeepsie, NY. After training, Claudine became one of the first Black Computer Programmers to work in the IBM Raleigh, NC Programming Laboratory.

After marrying, Claudine transferred to Charlottesville, VA and worked for IBM as a Systems Engineer until her husband was drafted into the Army. She then returned to the IBM Raleigh Programming Lab and worked until she resigned to accompany her husband to Kaiserslautern, Germany, where they lived for two years. Returning to IBM, she worked as a Systems Engineer for several years in Fayetteville, NC and later in Durham, NC, where she worked in the IBM Research Triangle Park Networking Laboratory. She designed and implemented the lab's Quality System and served as a global consultant for registering IBM software and hardware laboratories to the ISO 9001 international standard.

While at IBM, Claudine received several awards including: Systems Engineer of the Month several times; IBM World-Wide Systems Engineer Symposium; Distinguished Contribution Award, presented by the IBM Senior Vice-President and General Manager; and the Leadership Award in Achieving ISO 9001 Certification for the IBM RTP Networking Laboratory. She retired from IBM as a Senior Project Manager in July 2008 after a 39-year career.

Claudine believes in guiding our youth. She has been a mentor to middle school, high school, and NCCU students. She is a strong advocate for promoting good scholarship among students and providing funds to support their educational pursuits. She helped establish the NCCU AKA Endowed Scholarship and the NCCU Class of 1965 Endowed Scholarship funds. She has served on the Alpha Zeta Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. Scholarship Committee and has been the chairperson of the Hillside High School Class of 1961 Scholarship Committee for several years.

Having participated in sit-ins and protests during the Civil Rights Movement, Claudine served on the "Confronting Change" Committee to establish a permanent Civil Rights Exhibit at the Carolina Theatre in Durham, NC. She also is one of the founders of SS Renaissance Inc., a non-profit organization that supports the Performing Arts Department at Hillside High School. This organization was instrumental in bringing back "Swing School."

Claudine is a Golden Eagle and lifetime member of the NCCU Alumni Association; a Golden and lifetime member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.; a member of the National Alumni Association of Hillside High School; and a member of Union Baptist Church.

Claudine now spends her time on her family genealogy, sorority committees and other activities, volunteer projects at the Durham Rescue Mission and Urban Ministries, and traveling. She has visited over 110 major cities in 13 countries across North America and Europe.

Claudine is married to Elvis Lewis, Jr., with whom she has two sons: Elvis Lewis III and Kevin. She and her husband also have a daughter-in-law, Chaundra Mosley Lewis, and three granddaughters: Kennedy, Lauryn and Chandler.



James Sanders, Jr. Class of 1964

Mr. James Sanders, Jr. was born in Durham, North Carolina. He is the fourth of eight children of Irene and James Norris Sanders Sr. He attended the Durham Public Schools graduating from Hillside High School in 1964. He has an undergraduate Bachelor of Arts Degree from North Carolina Central University with Cum Laude honors, a Master of Science Degree from the State University of New York at New Paltz with Magna Cum Laude honors and completed additional graduate studies at Clark University in Worcester, Massachusetts.



Professionally, Mr. Sanders was an educator with experience on the secondary and collegiate levels. He completed thirty-three years as a social studies teacher in the Washingtonville Central School District and thirteen years as an adjunct instructor for Marist College in the Division of Humanities. Mr. Sanders' teaching philosophy centered on imparting knowledge wrapped around life-long learning and critical thinking skills with a sizeable dose of confidence and self-esteem ingrained in his students. He specialized in curriculum development and implementation to effectively teach students with varying academic ability ranging to honors and advanced placement classes. He wrote and implemented the District's Advance Placement American History course with eighty percent of his students scoring 4s and 5s on the national exam. His teaching in Washingtonville also served as a positive role model to his students, especially African-Americans because for many years he was the only African-American professional in the high school.

During his professional career Mr. Sanders received numerous awards. He was a two-time recipient of the Board of Education of the Washingtonville Central School District Award for Accomplishment in 1993 and 2003. In 1996 he was the recipient of the Mid-Hudson Social Studies Council Outstanding High School Social Studies Teaching Award. In 2000 he was the recipient of the Principal's ABCD Award (Above and Beyond the Call of Duty Award) and in 2004, while serving as the Director of Operations for the Glenn Hines Boys and Girls Club, Mr. Sanders was honored as the Employee of the Year.

During his residency in Newburgh, New York for more than forty years Mr. Sanders was actively involved in the civic and social affairs of the community. He served as an active board member of the 1st Book Reading Literacy of Orange County participating in their service initiatives. He was a member of the City of Newburgh Youth Bureau Prevention Policy Board and rendered services in support of their Youth Summit and Youth Pride Day Parade initiatives. He was a member of the local NAACP and worked closely with the Black and Hispanic Coalition in getting community leaders elected to public office. Through his service at the Glenn Hines Boys and Girls Club he coordinated the City of Newburgh's National Night Out Against Crime and Violence in 2004 and 2005 receiving national recognition each year for cities in its population class. He was an active member of the Majestic Club of Newburgh, New York serving as an officer in various positions over 35 years.

Fraternally, Mr. Sanders is a fifty-three years member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. He maintains active membership in the Upsilon Tau Chapter of Poughkeepsie, New York having devoted time and service as the Chapter's Basileus, Keeper of Records and Seals, Chair of the Upsilon Tau Scholarship Committee and participant in the Chapter's outreach and uplift initiatives. In addition, Mr. Sanders is a charter member of Masada Lodge # 115 of the Prince Hall Free and Accepted Masons of Newburgh, New York.

Presently Mr. Sanders is the president of the Hillside High School Class of 1964, an active participant and volunteer at the Durham Center for Senior life, a member of the North Carolina Central University Alumni Association, a member of the National Alumni Association of Hillside High School and maintains active membership in the United Methodist denomination as a member of the New Creation United Methodist Church in Durham. He serves faithfully in his church in several areas of ministry and is a Certified Lay Servant in the United Methodist denomination. Mr. Sanders firmly believes that his light should shine through his life work and service to others as stated in Matthew Chapter 5 Verse 16.

Grover C. Burthey, Jr.

Grover C. Burthey, Jr. was born at Lincoln Hospital, the son of Grover C. Burthey, Sr. and Thomasine Kirkland Burthey. He grew up on Fayetteville Street and enjoyed most of his youth at W.D. Hill Recreation Center and Hillside Park swimming pool. He was educated in the Durham Public



Schools until transferring to Phillips Academy in Andover, MA. where he finished High School. He attended Howard University for two years. He next enrolled at Cincinnati College of Mortuary Science where he received his degree in Mortuary Science and was then licensed as an Embalmer and Funeral Director in North Carolina. He later finished his undergraduate education at Duke University, where he received his B.A. degree in English Literature, with honors. Next, he received his Juris Doctor degree from UNC School of Law and was licensed to practice law in North Carolina.

In addition to his general practice of law, he served as Staff Attorney in the Legislative Services Office of the North Carolina General Assembly and later as Construction Coordinator for the NC Department of Administration Office of Historically Underutilized Businesses where he worked to increase minority participation on state construction projects.

All the while he practiced law, he always worked closely with his father, learning and gaining experience, and training as a master embalmer and restorative artist.

He and his wife, Pamela Monk Burthey, also a licensed Funeral Director, own and operate Burthey Funeral Service. They are members of Christian Faith Center of Creedmoor. They have three sons, Cleveland, Gaston and Kirkland and two grandsons, Luke and Simon.

H.M. "Mickey" Michaux, Jr.

Representative Henry M. Michaux, Jr. was born September 4, 1930 and attended the public schools of Durham, NC, and graduated from Palmer Memorial Institute, Sedalia, NC. He graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree from North Carolina Central University in 1952 and a Juris Doctor Degree with honors in 1964. Further graduate work was completed in Business Administration and Economics at North Carolina Central University and in Physiology and Biochemistry at Rutgers University. He served in the United States Army Medical Corps from 1952 until 1954; and in the Army Reserves from 1954 until 1960.



Representative Michaux has been a licensed and practicing Real Estate Broker and Property Casualty Agent and Broker in the State of North Carolina for 50 + years. He is a practicing attorney and was admitted to practice before all local and federal courts including the United States Supreme Court.

Representative Michaux was appointed by President Jimmy Carter in 1977 as the United States Attorney for the Middle District of North Carolina – the first African American to serve in that position in the South.

Representative Michaux served in the North Carolina House of Representatives and was elected in 1972 – 1977 and re-elected in 1984-present. Among his notable achievements in the North Carolina Legislature have been to serve as Senior Chair of Appropriations Committee (Chief Budget Writer) from 2007-2010, the election of African American judges, enhancements of voting rights, support of Historically Black Colleges and Universities and support of Minority Economic Development programs.

Representative Michaux was a founder and first chairperson of the North Carolina Black Leadership Caucus. He is the longest serving member in the North Carolina House of Representatives of the North Carolina General Assembly.

He served on the Board of Trustees of North Carolina Central University, Board of Directors of the North Carolina Central University Foundation and as the National President of the North Carolina Central University Alumni Association for three terms.

Among numerous honors and awards (too many to list), Representative Michaux received are an Honorary Doctor of Law degree from North Carolina Central University, inducted into the North Carolina Central University Athletic Hall of Fame, the naming of NCCU's School of Education and building, in his honor, to the "H. M. Michaux, Jr. School of Education", Spectacular Magazine's Man of the Year - Lifetime Achievement Award, NC NAACP Humanitarian Award, NC Justice Center - Champion of Justice Award, inducted into the National Black College Alumni Hall of Fame in the area of Government and was awarded the James E. Shepard Medallion by North Carolina Central University. He also received the Greater Durham Black Chamber of Commerce-2018 Man of the Year

Award, the Durham County Bar Association-2018 Inaugural Durham's Dedicated Award, the Greater Durham Chamber of Commerce-2019 Civic Honor Award, the North Carolina Association of Educators (NCAE)-2019 President's Award, the Durham Community MLK Jr Steering Committee-2019 Keeper of the Dream Award, North Carolina Bar Association 2019 Legal Legend of Color Award, the Order of the Long Leaf Pine and recognition in the Congressional Record of the US House of Representatives. He also received the Legacy Award from the Hillside High School Drama Department in 2019 and was recognized by the Hillside High School Class of 1970 for his service in 2018.

Representative Michaux is married to the former June Elizabeth Williams(HHS Class of 1970) and the family consists of two adult children and five grandchildren. He is a member of St. Joseph AME Church, a life time member of NAACP and a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity.
