

LeConte Freeman Stover

March 4, 1949 – September 12, 2020

LeConte Freeman Stover transitioned to be with his Heavenly Father on Saturday, September 12, 2020. LeConte, age 71, was born March 4, 1949, in Lancaster, South Carolina, the son of James Stover and Martha Massey. He lived the majority of his life in Durham, North Carolina. He was predeceased by his beloved wife, Dorna Conwell Stover, parents, and nine siblings. LeConte leaves behind three cherished children; Angelina Phillips, LeConte Conwell Stover (Raliana Vendrell) and Aiesha Conwell Stover, and three grandchildren. He leaves two brothers, Bobby and Jason (North Carolina), and a sister, Cleo Thompson (Philadelphia).

Leconte was a member of the Hillside High School Class of 1967 and Basketball Team. LeConte attended St Augustine's University in Raleigh, NC where he played collegiate basketball and met his future wife. He graduated from Sacred Heart University with a Bachelor of Science in Accounting, and later obtained a Master's of Business Administration from the University of New Haven.

He was certified as a Project Manager. He relocated to Maryland in 2009 where he worked at the Motor Vehicle Administrator overseeing many projects. Most recently he was a government contractor for the Department of Health and Human Services and Department of Veteran Affairs. In addition, he held other

positions as an adjunct professor at the Univerity of Bridgeport and Housatonic Community College both in Bridgeport, Connecticut. He also worked at People's Bank, GE and SNET of New Haven, CT.

A man of stature was well known in the community, serving those in need, especially volunteering at Junior Achievement. He served his community as a member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Incorporated in Stamford, Connecticut, and more recently the Upper Marlboro/ Waldorf Alumni Chapter. He most recently received his white jacket as he celebrated being an active member for 50 years. An avid tennis player that was known throughout many tennis clubs including the Newfield Tennis Association of Bridgeport Clubs. He also loved to travel with his family and was known to grill a few steaks.
